Thursday, January 20, 1927.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. R. H. Moyle of Hallowell.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

On motion by Mrs. Pinkham of Aroostook, it was

Ordered, the House concurring, that when the Senate and House adjourn, they adjourn to meet Tuesday, January 25, at four-thirty o'clock in the afternoon.

Sent down for concurrence.

Subsequently the foregoing order came back from the House, read and passed in concurrence.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

From the House: An act relating to the salaries of the Judge and Recorder of the Bangor Municipal Court.

In the House referred to the committee on Judiciary.

In the Senate on motion by Mr. Perkins of Penobscot, tabled pending reference.

From the House: An act to authorize the Portland Railroad Company to operate motor busses.

In the House referred to the committee on public utilities.

In the Senate referred in concurrence and 500 copies ordered printed.

The following communication from the Clerk of the House was read by the Secretary:

Sir:—

The Governor of the State having returned to the House:

"Resolve in favor of the town of

Norridgewock for repair of bridge across the Kennebec River" with his objections to the same; the House proceeded to vote on the question

"Shall the resolve be finally passed notwithstanding the objections of the Governor?"

A yea and nay vote was taken; nine members voted in the affirmative, and one hundred thirty-three in the negative, and accordingly the Resolve failed of a passage.

Ordered, the House concurring, that the Secretary of State be directed to furnish to clerks of committees, postage stamps and such other necessities for the transaction

of their business as said committee shall order.

On motion by Mr. Spear of Cumberland, it was:

Ordered, the House concurring, that the President and Treasurer of the State of Maine Associates be requested by the Secretary of the Senate to prepare for the information of the Eighty-third Legislature a statement of moneys in-

cluding the names of the persons or organizations contributing same and how and where said money was dispensed, listing names and amounts when said money was expended and purpose therefor.
