February 15, 1927.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. C. E. Young, of Hallowell.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

Reports of Committees

Mr. Crafts from the Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game, on bill, An Act to regulate fishing in the Silver Lakes, so-called in Manchester, Sidney and Belgrade, (S. P. 24) reported that the same ought to pass.

The report was read and accept-

ed, and the bill laid upon the table for printing under the joint rules.

Passed to Be Engrossed

An Act to authorize the town of Boothbay Harbor to raise money to help keep in repair the old burying ground situated in the town of Boothbay. (H. D. 19)

Orders of the Day

On motion by Mr. Speirs of Cumberland, the Senate voted to take from the table the Resolve in favor of St. Louis Home for Boys, (S. P. 209) tabled by that senator earlier in today's session, pending reference, and on further motion by the same senator the resolve was referred to the Committee on Education.

On motion by Mr. Carter of Androscoggin, the Senate voted to take from the table An Act relating to issue of prior preference stock by Boston & Maine R. R. in exchange for certain bonds, (S. P. 156) tabled by that Senator on February 10th, pending reference, and on further motion by the same Senator the bill was referred to the Committee on Public Utilities.

On motion by Mrs. Pinkham of Aroostook, the Senate voted to reconsider its action whereby House Paper 488, Resolve in favor of Pennell Institute at Gray, was referred on the last legislative day to the Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs.

Mrs. PINKHAM: Mr. President, this is just the usual variety of academy resolve which is always referred to the Committee on Education, and I now move that it be so referred.

The motion prevailed.

On motion by Mr. Mitchell of Aroostook, the Senate voted to take from the table, Resolve in favor of the Aroostook Test Laboratory, (H. P. 477), tabled by that Senator on February 11th, pending reference, and on further motion by the same Senator the resolve was referred to the Committee on Public Health, in concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Crafts of Piscataquis, the Senate voted to take from the table An Act relating to a bounty on porcupines or hedgehogs, tabled by that Senator on February 11th, pending reference.

Mr. CRAFTS: Mr. President, as through investigation I find that the damage that the hedgehog is doing to our forests is very great, I think it is right that this should be referred to the Committee on State Lands and Forest Preservation for them to seriously consider and I therefore move that this bill be referred to that committee in non-concurrence.

The motion prevailed.

On motion by the same Senator, the Senate voted to take from the table the several petitions with reference to the foregoing bill, which were tabled by that gentleman earlier in today's session pending reference and on further motion by the same Senator, the petitions were referred to the Committee on State Lands and Forest Preservation with the bill.

On motion by Mr. Bragdon of Aroostook Adjourned until tomorrow morn-February 16th at 10 o'clock.
