**SENATE**

Thursday, January 19, 1933.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. J. Reid Howes of Hallowell.

Journal of Wednesday, January 18th read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

The following bills and resolve were received and on recommendation by the committee on reference of bills were referred to the following committees:

**Claims**

Mrs. Gay of Lincoln: Resolve in favor of Charles H. French of Coopers Mills, R. No. 2 (Somerville, Maine). (S. P. 56).

Sent down for concurrence.

**Inland Fisheries and Game**

Mr. Blaisdell of Hancock: An Act relating to Hatcase Pond, Mountainy Pond, Burnt Pond, and tributaries, in the counties of Hancock and Penobscot. (S. P. 57).

Mr. Bissett of Cumberland: An Act to open Little Sebago Lake in Cumberland County to ice fishing. (S. P. 61). With petition signed by Percy R. Webster of Gray and 105 others of Cumberland and petition signed by George A. Morrill and 166 others of Cumberland County.

Mr. Holman of Franklin: An Act relating to ice fishing in Varnum Pond, in the towns of Temple and Wilton, in the County of Franklin. (S. P. 58).

The same Senator: An Act relating to Ice Fishing in Sweet's Pond, or Porter Lake, in the towns of New Vineyard and Strong, in the county of Franklin. (S. P. 59).

Sent down for concurrence.

**Public Utilities**

Mr. Weatherbee of Penobscot: An Act relating to costs recoverable in the law court. (S. P. 60).

Ordered, the House concurring, (S. P. 62) that when the Senate and House adjourn, they adjourn to meet Tuesday, January 24th, 1933, at

four-thirty o'clock in the afternoon.

**Committee Reports**

Mr. Farnsworth of Aroostook from the Committee on Legal Affairs on bill "An Act to empower the county commissioners of Hancock County to construct a highway and raise money for the same" (S. P. 35, L. D. 9) reported that the same ought to pass.

Mr. Blaisdell from the same Committee on bill "An Act to amend Section 110 of Chapter 5, Revised Statutes of Maine for 1930" (S. P. 36, L. D. 11) reported that the same ought to pass.

Which reports were read and accepted.

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Harmon of Hancock, the rules were suspended, the bills given their two several readings and passed to be engrossed.

On motion by Mr. Robie of Cumberland, it was

Ordered, that there be recalled from the files of the Senate, order relative to providing each officer and member with a copy of the Revised Statutes, for such further action as the Senate may order.

On motion by Mr. Jackson of Cumberland, the Senate voted to take from the table, An Act relating to store licenses (H. P. 14, L. D. 5) tabled by that Senator on January 18th pending reference in concurrence.

Mr. JACKSON of Cumberland: Mr. President, I now yield to the Senator from Somerset, Senator Weeks.

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Weeks of Somerset this bill was referred to the Committee on Taxation in non-concurrence.

Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Jackson of Cumberland, the Senate voted to take from the table, An Act relating to store license fees (H. P. 15, L. D. 6) tabled by that Senator on January 18th pending reference in concurrence.

Mr. JACKSON of Cumberland: Mr. President, I now yield to the

Senator from Somerset, Senator Weeks.

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Weeks of Somerset this bill was referred to the Committee on Taxation in non-concurrence.

Sent down for concurrence.
