Orders of the Day

On motion by Mr. Kitchen of Aroostook, the Senate voted to take from the table, House Report from the Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game, "Ought to Pass" on "An Act Closing to All Fishing for a Period of Four Years Fish River Falls," (H. P. 203) (L. D. 111) tabled by that Senator on February 16th

pending acceptance of the report. Mr. KITCHEN of Aroostook: Mr. President, by way of explanation I will say that of course I am in favor of this, but the bill does not provide or specify as to restrictions, that is to say, how far up or down the river these restrictions shall apply. In attempting to secure a proper amendment. I have been informed by the Revisor of Statutes that the bill is not properly drawn. He has suggested it be recommitted to the Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game for redraft, and acting upon his advice, I move the bill be recommitted to the Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game for a new draft.

The motion prevailed and the bill was recommitted to the Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game.

On motion by Mr. Holmes of Androscoggin, the Senate voted to take from the table, House Report from the Committee on Judiciary "Ought

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to pass in a new draft" on "An Act to validate a loan to the City of Lewiston and to authorize said city to issue its bonds in payment therefor" (H. P. 1233, L. D. 641), tabled by that Senator on February 16th pending acceptance of the report; and on further motion by the same Senator the report of the committee was accepted in concurrence.

Was accepted in concurrence. Thereupon, that Senator offered Senate Amendment "A" and moved its adoption: "Senate Amendment 'A' to House Paper 1233, Legislative Document 641, Bill, An Act to validate a loan negotiated by the City of Lewiston and to authorize said City to issue its bonds in payment therefor. Amend the title of said bill by striking out the words 'and to authorize said city to issue its bonds in payment therefor,' so that the title of said bill shall read as follows: 'An Act to validate a loan negotiated by the City of Lewiston.'"

Thereupon Senate Amendment "A" was adopted, the bill as so amended was given its first reading and tomorrow assigned for second reading.

On motion by Mr. Weatherbee of Penobscot, the Senate voted to take from the table, House Report from the Committee on Judiciary "Ought to pass" on "An Act relating to the Odd Fellows Home in Maine" (H. P. 216, L. D. 636), tabled by that Senator on February 16 pending acceptance of the report.

Mr. WEATHERBEE of Penobscot: Mr. President, I yield to the Senator from Somerset, Senator Weeks.

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Weeks of Somerset, the report of the committee "Ought to pass" was accepted in concurrence, the bill was given its first reading and tomorrow assigned for second reading.

On motion by Mr. Page of Somer-

set, the Senate voted to take from the table. Senate Report from the Committee on Judiciary "Ought not to pass" on "An Act to charge passengers in motor vehicles with the negligence of the driver in certain cases" (S. P. 156, L. D. 210), tabled by that Senator on February 17th pending acceptance of the report; and on further motion by the same Senator the report of the Committee "Ought not to pass" was accepted.

On motion by Mr. Littlefield of York, the Senate voted to take from the table, An Act prescribing a schedule of fees for registration of motor vehicles, (H. P. 1166) (L. D. 687) tabled by that Senator on February 17th, pending reference to a committee; and on further motion by the same Senator, the bill was referred to the Committee on Taxation, in concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Littlefield of York, the Senate voted to take from the table, An Act prescribing a schedule of fees for registration of motor trucks, (H. P. 1165) (L. D. 688), tabled by that Senator on Feburary 17th, pending reference to a committee; and on further motion by the same Senator, the bill was referred to the Committee on Taxation, in concurrence.
