Mr. SCHNURLE of Cumberland:
May I inquire, Mr. President, to
what committee the bill was

originally referred?

The PRESIDENT: The suggested reference of the committee on reference of bills was to the Committee on Legal Affairs.

Mr. HUSSEY: Mr. President, the suggestion to the committee by myself who presented the bill was ref-erence to the Committee on Ju-diciary I believe this bill should go to the Committee on Judiciary on account of the several questions of constitutionality of the act and I see no reason at all why the Committee on Judiciary should not have the bill.

Mr. HATHAWAY: Presi-Mr. dent, we have had this bill before us during a number of sessions and it has been customary to refer the bill to the Committee on Legal Affairs. That was why I called for a division, because it had been customary in the past to refer this

bill to the Committee on Legal Affairs and I see no reason why we

should change.

Mr. HUSSEY: Mr. President, I think that perhaps I might correct the Senator from Piscataquis (Senator Hathaway) that this bill has also been previously referred to the Committee on Taxation, but it is a matter of regulation rather than taxation and I think it should go to the Committee on Judiciary.

The PRESIDENT: The question is on the motion of the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Hussey, that this bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary, and the Senator from Piscataguis, Senator

Hathaway, has asked for a division.

A division of the Senate was had. Ten having voted in the affirmative and thirteen opposed, the mo-tion to refer the bill to the Commit-

tee on Judiciary did not prevail.
Mr. HATHAWAY: Mr. President, I move that this bill be referred to the Committee on Legal Affairs.

The PRESIDENT: The Chair

entertains the motion.

Mr. HUSSEY: Mr. President, I see that there are a few absentees in the Senate this morning whom I know would like to vote upon the question I will therefore ask the Senate to again give me the privilege of laying the bill on the table.
