#### SENATE

Thursday, December 17, 1936. Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Reverend Herbert E. P. Pressey of Augusta. Journal of yesterday read and ap-

proved.

The PRESIDENT: Is there any business to come before the Senate this morning? If not, the Chair believes it might be well to keep in session during the day and would suggest a recess until four o'clock this afternoon.

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Burkett of Cumberland, Recessed until this afternoon at

four o'clock.

#### After Recess

Senate called to order by the President.

From the House: the following order, out of order and under suspension of the rules:

Ordered, the Senate concurring, that the Governor of this sovereign state of Maine be directed to extend forthwith an invitation to the sole remaining sovereign state of Vermont to join with Maine in the per-petuation of the Declaration of In-dependence, the preservation of our Constitution, and a return to the United States of our forefathers.

In the House, read and passed. In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Burkett of Cumberland, the order was indefinitely postponed in nonconcurrence.

Sent down for concurrence.

Paper from the House disposed of in concurrence.

### Report of Committee

(Out of Order)

Mr. Fernald from the Committee on Judiciary on bill, "An Act Relative to the Deer Isle-Sedgwick Bridge District" (S. P. 740) (L. D. 940) reported that the same ought to pass.

Thereupon, the report was accepted and under suspension of the rules the bill was given its two several readings and passed to be engrossed.

Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Burkett of Cumberland Recessed until four-thirty o'clock.
