Tuesday, January 14, 1941.

The Senate was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the R Staples of Gardiner. Reverend Louis

The following bills were received by the and on recommendation Committee on Reference of Bills were referred to the following committees:

Pensions

Mr. Melvin of Androscoggin presented "Resolve Providing for a State Pension for Cecil Esters Lewiston." (S. P. 50) Sent down for concurrence.

Taxation

Mr. Bate of Kennebec presented Bill "An Act Relating to Taxes on Cottages and Camps." (S. P. 60) (500 copies ordered printed.) Sent down for concurrence.

Joint Order

From the House:

On motion by Mr. Whitney Penobscot, it was

ORDERED, the House concurring, that there be paid to committee clerks, messengers, and stenographers as advance on compensation such amounts as may be recommended by their respective committee chairmen which shall be included in fortnightly lists certified to the state controller by the joint standing committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs. (S. P. 61)

Sent down for concurrence.

Final Committee Report Mr. Sanborn of Cumberland presented Final Report of the Committee on Administrative Code. (S. P. 62)

Which was read and accepted and 1,000 copies ordered printed. Sent down for concurrence.

From the House:

Joint Order

(Out of Order)

ORDERED, the House concurring that the joint rules be amended by adding thereto the following

'22. A copy of each joint order requiring action by any department, commission. board bureau, agency of the state which is passed by both branches of the legislature shall be forwarded to such department, bureau, commission, board or agency by the secretary of the senate immediately after the adjournment for the legislative day in which the order was passed by the con-curring branch of the legislature. Another copy of all such orders shall be sent to the Revisor of Statutes, and shall be published in the official volume of the public laws." (S. P.

(In the Senate, on Jan. 1, 1941, read and passed.)

Comes from the House, indefinitely postponed in non-concurrence.

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Elliot of Knox tabled pending consideration.

Orders of the Day

On motion by Mr. Brown of Aroostook, the Senate voted to reconsider its action of the last legislature day whereby an Act Relating to Automobile Travel by State In-spectors of Seed Potatoes (S. P. 55) (L. D. 10) was referred to the Committee on Salaries and Fees; and on further motion by the same Sena-tor the bill was referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Friend Somerset

Adjourned until tomorrow morning at ten o'clock.
