SENATE

Thursday, January 16, 1941. The Senate was called to order by the President.

Ordered, the House concurring. that a Joint Select Committee consisting of seven members on the part of the Senate to be appointed by the President of the Senate, and sixteen members on the part of the House to be appointed by the Speaker of the House, be appointed to consider the apportionments and assignments of Councillor Districts, Senatorial Districts, and Districts for Representatives to the Legislature, as well as such matters as relate to the apportionment and as-signment of Congressional Districts, and report to this Legislature by bill or otherwise.
