**SENATE**

Tuesday, January 28, 1941

The Senate was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Reverend Oscar Withee of Gardiner.

On motion by Mr. Harkins of Androscoggin, out of order and under suspension of the rules, it was

ORDERED, the House concurring, that Senate Paper 83, Legislative Document 70, bill, An Act Relating to the Charter of the City of Lewiston be recalled to the Senate from the Committee on Legal Affairs.
