SENATE

Thursday, February 13, 1941

The Senate was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Reverend Gordon Washburn of Hallowell.

Journal of yesterday read and approved.

From the House:

Joint Order

ORDERED, the Senate concurring, that the Commissioner of Health and Welfare be directed to furnish to the Legislature the names and residences of all persons receiving pensions from the State, arranged by towns and counties; and be it further

ORDERED, that one thousand copies of such information be printed. (H. P. 1503)

Which was read and passed in concurrence.

Papers from the House referred in concurrence.

House Committee Reports Ought Not to Pass

The Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs on "Resolve in Favor of the Town of Orono," (H. P. 1117) reported that leave be granted to withdraw the same.

The Committee on Taxation on Bill "An Act Relative to Re-Valuation Surveys," (H. P. 478) (L. D. 212) reported that the same ought not to pass.

Emergency Measure

Bill "An Act Relating to the Reorganization of Corporations under the National Bankruptcy Act." (S. P. 66) (L. D. 40)

Which bill being an emergency measure and having received the affirmative vote of 26 members of the Senate and none opposed, was passed to be enacted.

Orders

On motion by Mr. Friend of Somerset, it was

ORDERED that the use of the Senate Chamber be extended to the Maine State Florists Association Monday morning, February the 17th, at ten o'clock.

On motion by Mr. Snow of Piscataquis, it was

ORDERED that 750 copies be printed of Senate Paper 430, relative to report of the Bureau of Personnel.

Orders of the Day

On motion by Mr. Brown of Aroostook, 500 additional copies of bill An Act Creating the Caribou Utilities District (L. D. 227) were ordered printed.

On motion by Mr. Emery of Hancock, the Senate voted to take from the table bill, An Act Relating to Duties of Superintending School Committees (S. P. 331) tabled by that Senator on February 12 pending reference; and on further motion by the same Senator the bill was referred to the Committee on Public Health and 500 copies ordered printed.
