SENATE

Wednesday, January 20, 1943

The Senate was called to order

by the President. Prayer by the Reverend Gordon Washburn of Hallowell. Journal of yesterday read and

approved.

Order

Out of order and under suspension of the rules, on motion by Mr. Elliot of Knox, it was

ORDERED, the House concur-ring, that when the Senate and House adjourn at the close of this week's session, they adjourn to meet on Tuesday morning, January 26th, 1943, at 11:30 A. M. (S. P. 24)

Sent down for concurrence.

Subsequently the foregoing order was returned from the House, having been read and passed in concurrence.

Bill "An Act Amending the Old Age Assistance Law." (S. P. 71) (L. D. 6) (In the Senate on January 14

referred to the Committee on Pensions)

Comes from the House, referred to the Committee on Welfare in non-concurrence.

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Friend of Somerset, that Body voted to recede from its former action whereby the bill was referred to the Committee on Pensions and the bill was then referred to the Committee on Welfare in concurrence

Passed to Be Enacted

Bill "An Act Accepting from Percival Proctor Baxter the Con-veyance and Deed of Gift of twelve thousand (12,000) acres of land in township five (5) range nine (9) W. E. L. S. Piscataquis County, and the conveyance and Deed of Gift of Mackworth Island in the town of Falmouth, Portland Harbor, Casco Bay, and establishing the Mack-worth Island Trust Fund." (S. P. 29)

Orders of the Day

Out of order and under suspen-sion of the rules, Mr. Owen of Ken-nebec presented Resolve Expressing the Appreciation of the State for the Gifts of Land to the State by the Hon. Percival Proctor Bax-ter; and on motion by the same Senator under suspension of the rules the Resolve was given its two several readings and passed to be engrossed without reference to a committee.

Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Bishop of Sagadahoc, the Senate voted to reconsider its action taken earlier in today's session whereby bill, An Act Relating to Annual Audit of Municipalities (S. P. 99) was re-ferred to the Committee on Legal Affairs; and on further motion by the same Senator the bill was laid upon the table pending reference.

Joint Order

Out of order and under suspension of the rules, on motion by Mr.

Emery of Hancock, it was ORDERED, the House concur-ring that the room on the ground floor formerly occupied by the In-dustrial Accident Commission be assigned for the permanent use of the Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs.

Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Farris of Kennebec, the Senate voted to take from the table, Resolve Authorizing the Purchase of Property for the State (S. P. 78) tabled by that Senator on January 19 pending refer-ence; and on further motion by the same Senator, the Resolve was referred to the Committee on Appro-priations and Financial Affairs. Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Elliot of Knox Adjourned until tomorrow morning at ten o'clock.

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
