SENATE

Tuesday, January 26, 1943.

The Senate was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Reverend Oscar Withee of Gardiner. Journal of Thursday, January 21,

1943, read and approved.

From the House:

Joint Order

ORDERED, the Senate concur-House and Senate, to consist of seven members, is hereby created consisting of four members on the part of the House and three members on the part of the Senate, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House and the President of the Senate, and the President of the Senate, ex officio, shall be one of the three members on the part of the Senate and the Speaker of the House, ex officio, shall be one of the four members on the part of the House.

And be it further ordered that any person authorized to make purchases of materials, supplies, equip-ment or of any sort for and on be-half of the Legislature shall forthwith upon making any such pur-chase file with the said committee herein created a detailed statement of the materials, supplies or equipment so purcha the cost thereof. purchased together with

And be it further ordered that the Chairman of each joint standing committee of the Legislature which shall have any expenditure which shall have any expenditure during this legislative session on account of any clerks, stenographers, mes-sengers or other employees shall sengers or other employees shall before filing a final report of said committee file with the committee herein created a statement showing the number of public hearings held by said joint standing committee, the number of executive sessions, the name of any employee and the of compensation amou: recommended by said joint standing com-mittee to be paid to said employe.

And be it further ordered that the committee herein created shall compile in an orderly fashion all of the expenditures so reported to it, and at the adjournment of the Legislature shall cause an inventory to be made of all materials, supplies and equipment which are on hand at the time of said adjournment and said committee shall report by

a written report to be filed with the Clerk of the House and the Secre-tary of the Senate its list of all the purchases made in behalf of the Legislature and its list of expendiployees engaged on behalf of the Legislature and its inventory of materials, supplies and equipment, which said report shall be a public record and said committee shall be reimbursed for its necessary expenses in carrying out the provi-sions of this order and shall have the authority to engage such assistants as may be necessary for the purposes herein set forth. In the House read and passed. In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Clement of Androscoggin, the or-der was laid upon the table pending passage in concurrence.

Thereupon, on motion by the same Senator, it was ORDERED, the House concur-ring, that Room 28 be assigned for the permanent use of the Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game, and that the Acting Superintendent of Buildings be authorized and directed to remove the partition in said room.
