ORDERED, that a message be sent to the House of Representatives proposing a Joint Convention to be held forthwith in the Hall of the House for the purpose of listening to an address by the Honorable Roane Waring, of Memphis, Tennessee, National Commander of the American Legion.

The Secretary delivered the message and subsequently reported that he had performed the duty assigned to him.

Subsequently a message was received from the House of Representatives, by Mr. Pease, its Clerk, concurring in the proposition for a

Joint Convention for the purpose of listening to an address by the Honorable Roane Waring, National Commander of the American Legion.

Thereupon the Senate retired to the Hall of the House of Representatives where a Joint Convention was formed.
