SENATE

Tuesday, February 16, 1943. The Senate was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Reverend Wesley U. Riedel of Augusta.

Journal of Friday, February 12, 1943, read and approved.

Papers from the House referred in concurrence.

From the House:

The Committee on Taxation on Bill "An Act to Exempt Members of the Armed Forces from Poll Taxes," (H. P. 39) (L. D. 28) reported that the same ought to pass as amended by Committee Amendment "A" submitted herewith.

Which reports were severally read and accepted in concurrence, the bills read once, Committee Amendments "A" severally read and adopted in concurrence, and the bills as amended tomorrow assigned for second reading.

Passed to be Engrossed

Bill "An Act Relating to Permits by Cities and Towns to Pipe Line Companies." (H. P. 617) (L. D. 366) Which bill was read a second time and passed to be engrossed in

Bill "An Act Relating to Bounty on Bobcats, etc." (S. P. 43) (L. D. 428)

The bill was given its second reading.

The Secretary read Committee Amendment A:

Committee Amendment "A" to S. P. 43, Bill "An Act Relating to Bounty on Bobcats, etc."

Amend said bill by inserting in the 7th line of the 1st section there-of after the word 'claimant' the following underlined words:

"within 10 days after he has killed such animal."

and by inserting in the 4th line of section 2 after the word 'claimant' the following underlined words:

"within 72 hours after he has killed such animal.³

Orders of the Day

On motion by Mr. Dow of Oxford, the Senate voted to take from the table, bill, "An Act Providing for Experience Rating Under Employment Compensation Law" (S. P. 282) tabled by that Senator on February 10 pending reference; and on further motion by the same Senator, the bill was referred to the Committee on Federal Relations.

Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Elliot of Knox, the Senate voted to take from the table bill, "An Act Relating to Hunting and Fishing Licenses" (H. P. 828) (L. D. 467) tabled by that Senator on February 12 pending reference in concurrence; and that Senator yielded to the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Hanold.

On motion by Mr. Hanold of Cumberland, the bill was referred to the Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game in non-concurrence.

Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Elliot of Knox, the Senate voted to take from the table "Resolve Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution to Limit to Highway Purposes the Use of Revenues Derived from the Taxation of Vehicles Used on the Public Highways, and Fuels Used for Propulsion of such Vehicles" (S. P. 233) tabled by that Senator on February 4 pending reference.

Mr. ELLIOT: Mr. President, I move that this resolve be referred to the Committee on Ways and Bridges, as suggested.

Mr. McGLAUFLIN of Cumberland: Mr. President, I think that is a bill that should go to a legal committee and not to the Committee on Ways and Bridges. Therefore I ask to have the bill retabled.

Thereupon, the bill was laid upon the table pending motion to refer to the Committee on Ways and Bridges.

On motion by Mr. Elliot of Knox Adjourned until tomorrow morning at ten o'clock.
