Mr. SANBORN of Cumberland: Mr. President, the bill was tabled because in listening to the reading of the amendment I was not certain that it had not been incorrectly transcribed. On examination I find that it is transcribed correctly and I now move the adoption of Committee Amendment A.

Committee Amendment A was adopted, and the bill as amended by Committee Amendment A was tomorrow assigned for second read-
