# SENATE

Thursday, March 18, 1943.

The Senate was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. Cymbrid Hughes of Augusta.

Since that time we have talked with Mr. Page and he feels where the state contributes so much money to the institutions, they should have a right to go in and inspect institutions, if necessary. Therefore, he felt he would like to have the bill pass. Since then, in talking with members of the committee, I have found there are no objections to the passage of the bill, and I therefore second the motion made by the Senator from Aroostook. Senator Brown.
