SENATE

Monday, March 22, 1943 The Senate was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Reverend J. C. Rice of Hallowell.

Journal of Friday, March 19th, 1943, read and approved.

From the House

Joint Order:

ORDERED, the Senate concurcurring, that Rule 8 of the Joint Rules be amended by striking out at the end thereof the following:

"and the Secretary of the Senate shall enter on the journal of the Senate the day on which such bills or resolutions are so presented to the Governor," and inserting in place thereof the following:

"and the Secretary of the Senate shall communicate to the Senate, the House and the Secretary of State the time which such bills or resolutions are so presented to the Governor, which time shall be entered upon the Journals of the Senate and House." (H. P. 1298)

In the House, read and passed.

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Elliot of Knox, tabled pending passage in concurrence.

Which reports were severally read and accepted in concurrence.

The Committee on Agriculture on Bill "An Act Relating to the Protection of Bees," (H. P. 763) (L. D. 408) reported the same in a new draft (H. P. 1282) (L. D. 797) under the same title, and that it ought to pass.

The Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs on "Resolve Relating to Payment of Special Legislative Pensions from Appropriations for Same," (H. P. 768) (L. D. 412) reported the same in a new draft (H. P. 1283) (L. D. 798) under a new title, Bill "An Act Relating to Payment of Special Legislative Pensions from Appropriations for Same," and that it ought to pass.

(On motion by Mr. Brown of Aroostook, tabled pending acceptance of the report in concurrence.)

The Committee on Banks and Banking on Bill "An Act Relating to the Bank Commissioner's Office," (H. P. 236) (L. D. 185) reported the same in a new draft, (H. P. 1284) (L. D. 799) under the same title and that it ought to pass.

The Committee on Judiciary on Bill "An Act to Clarify the Laws Relating to Paroles and Good Time Allowances to Convicts in State Prison," (H. P. 796) (L. D. 379) reported that the same ought to pass.

Which reports were severally read and accepted in concurrence, the bills and resolve read once, and tomorrow assigned for second reading.

The Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game on Bill "An Act Relative to Hunting Foxes with Hounds in the County of Franklin," (H. P. 241) (L. D. 160) reported that the same ought to pass as amended by Committee Amendment "A" submitted herewith.

The Committee on Judiciary on Bill "An Act Relating to Members of Teachers' Retirement System in Military Service," (H. P. 549) (L. D. 311) reported that the same ought to pass as amended by Committee Amendment "A" submitted herewith. The Committee on Legal Affairs on Bill "An Act Relating to Municipal Planning and Zoning," (H. P. 190) (L. D. 127) reported that the same ought to pass as amended by Committee Amendment A submitted herewith.

Which reports were severally read and accepted in concurrence, and the bills read once; Committee Amendments A were severally read and adopted in concurrence, and the bills as amended were tomorrow assigned for second reading.

The Committee on Judiciary on Bill "An Act Further Amending the Financial Responsibility Law," (H. P. 1122) (L. D. 587) reported that the same ought to pass as amended by Committee Amendment A submitted herewith.

Which report was read and accepted in concurrence, and the bill was given its first reading.

Committee Amendment A was read.

Thereupon on motion by Mr. Boucher of Androscoggin, the bill was laid upon the table pending adoption of Committee Amendment A in concurrence.

The Committee on Legal Affairs on Bill "An Act to Provide a Town Manager Form of Government for the Town of Brunswick," (H. P. 187) (L. D. 129) reported that the same ought to pass.

In the House passed to be engrossed as amended by House Amendment "A".

In the Senate, the report was read and accepted in concurrence and the bill was given its first reading; House Amendment A was read and adopted in concurrence, and the bill as so amended was tomorrow assigned for second reading.

The Majority of the Committee on Legal Affairs on Bill "An Act Relating to Fees Allowed under the Tax Lien Law, so-called," (H. P. 1213) (L. D. 694) reported that the same ought not to pass.

Orders of the Day

On motion by Mr. Hanold of Cumberland the Senate voted to take from the table, Senate Report from the Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game "Ought to Pass in New Draft" on bill, "An Act to Simplify the Inland Fishing Laws" (New Draft S. P. 455) tabled by that Senator on March 19th pending acceptance of the report; and on further motion by the same Senator, the report of the Committee was ac-cepted and the bill was given its first reading and tomorrow assigned for second reading.

On motion by Mr. Farris of Ken-On motion by Mr. Farris of Ken-nebec, the Senate voted to take from the table, bill "An Act Relating to Salary of County Treasurer and Clerk Hire for County of Kennebec" (S. P. 269) (L. D. 457) tabled by that Senator on March 17th pending edention of House Amendment. "A" adoption of House Amendment "A" in concurrence; and on further mo-Amendment "A" was adopted in concurrence, and the bill as so amended was passed to be engrossed in concurrence.

On motion by Mr Elliot of Knox, the Senate voted to reconsider its action of Friday, March 19th, where-by bill, "An Act Revising the Military Law" (H. P. 1245) (L. D. 746) was passed to be engrossed in con-currence. Thereupon, on further motion by the same Senator, the bill was laid upon the table pending passage to be engrossed in concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Harvey of York, the Senate voted to take from the table, House Report from the Committee on Mercantile Affairs and Insurance, Majority Report "Ought Not to Pass", Minority Report Not to Pass", Minority Report "Ought to Pass" on bill, An Act Re-lating to Standard Form Insurance Policy (H. P. 959) (L. D. 496) tabled by that Senator on March 19th pending acceptance of either report; and on further motion by the same Senator the majority report "Ought Not to Pass" was accepted in concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Worthen of Penobscot, the Senate voted to take from the table, bill "An Act Relat-Tom the table, but An Act Relat-ing to Hunting and Trapping of Foxes" (H. P. 1240) (L. D. 739) tabled by that Senator on March 16th pending adoption of Senate Amendment "A".

Mr. WORTHEN of Penobscot: Mr. President, I now move the indefinite postponement of Senate Amend-ment "A" and in explanation I wish to state that I wish to offer Senate Amendment "B". It does not change the meaning of the bill. There is an error in Senate Amendment "A". I wish to correct it by offering Senate Amendment "B".

The motion prevailed and Senate Amendment "A" was indefinitely postponed.

Thereupon, Mr. Worthen present-ed Senate Amendment "B" and and moved its adoption:

"Senate Amendment 'B'. Amend said bill by striking out all of Section 1 thereof after the headnote thereof and substituting the follow-ing in place thereof 'for a period of two years from the effective date of this act it shall be lawful to dig out foxes at any time and to hunt foxes at any time except Sunday in organized territory in this state. It shall also be lawful for a period of two years from the effective date of this act to trap foxes or to cause to have foxes trapped at any time on one's own land within a distance of one hundred yards from a range or sheater where poultry is raised or kept."

Senate Amendment "B" was adopted, and the bill as amended was tomorrow assigned for second reading.

On metion by Mr. Elliot of Knox, the Senate voted to take from the table bill "An Act Relating to Sig-nature of State Treasurer" (S. P. 294) (L. D. 443) tabled by that Senator on March 4 pending passage to be engrossed; and that Senator presented Senate Amendment A and moved its adoption.

The Secretary read Senate Amendment A:

"Senate Amendment 'A' to S. P. 294, L. D. 443, Bill 'An Act Relating to the Signature of the Treasurer of State.

"Amend said Bill by adding at the end of the title thereof the following:

'and Endorsement of Bonds in the State Treasury.'

Further amend said Bill by adding before the headnote thereof the following: 'Sec. 1.'

Further amend said Bill by adding at the end thereof the following:

'Sec. 2. R. S. c. 2, § 83, repealed. Section 83 of chapter 2 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed.'"

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Elliot of Knox, the bill and the amendment were laid upon the table pending adoption of Senate Amendment A.

On motion by Mr. Bishop of Sagadahoc, the Senate voted to reconsider its action taken earlier in today's session whereby the 'Ought Not to Pass' report of the Com-mittee on Legal Affairs on Bill, "An Act Forbidding the Use of Revolving Doors" (S. P. 422) (L. D. 718) was accepted; and on further motion by the same Senator the bill and the report were laid upon the table pending acceptance of the report.

On motion by Mr. Elliot of Knox Adjourned until tomorrow morning at ten o'clock.
