MAINE DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION

January 5, 1945

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of the 92nd Legislature:

The Maine Development Commission transmits, herewith, its final report on Post War Planning.

The Maine Development Commission was directed by the 91st Legislature to "cooperate with the various departments of the state, the Federal government or any of its agencies, the municipalities of this state, or private agencies within this state in developing and coordinating long-range plans for post war activities, and shall report to the next special or regular session of the legislature on its activities under this section."

The report covers these activities and findings.

ORDERED, that the Secretary of the Senate cause a copy of this order to be published in all the daily and weekly papers of the State, commencing January 23, 1945, and continuing up to and including Feb. 7, 1945 (S. P. 60)

ORDERED, the House concurring, that all matters pertaining to advertising, committee record binders, paper supplies and rubber stamps be referred to the Superintendent of Public Printing, who shall handle such matters under the direction of the Secretary of the Senate and Clerk of the House (S. P. 52)
