Committee Amendment "A" to S. P. 143. L. D. 349, Bill, "An Act to Amend the Charter of Lincoln Academy".

Academy". Amend said Bill by striking out all of section 6 and inserting in place thereof the following:

"Sec. 6. Officers elected annually. There shall be a president, vicepresident, secretary, treasurer and an executive committee. The executive committee shall consist of 3 members, president to serve ex officio. The officers, with the exception of the executive committee, shall be elected annually. The executive committee shall first be elected one for a term of 1 year, one for a term of 2 years and one for a term of 3 years, and as each term expires a member of the executive committee shall be elected for a period of 3 years. The officers and members of the executive committee shall be elected from members of the board of trustees and their acts shall be governed by the bylaws of the corporation."

Committee Amendment "A" was adopted in concurrence, and tomorrow assigned for third reading of the Bill.
