Because of the fact that under the present method of printing it takes a long time to get out the Legislative Record, it would be very desirable, it seems, for each of us to have a copy of this book, showing just what did happen to each bill and resolve placed before the Legislature. It will not incur a lot of extra expense, as everything used in this book can be used in the other one. It would

just mean placing on this same record the final disposition of each bill and resolve. It would be about a day's work, as the Clerk's office informs us, to do this job.
