Under the law as it now stands, as I am informed, the State of Maine has lost a great deal of money by reason of inability to assess these taxes. The measure which I am introducing will give the Tax Assessor the right to assess State, County and Forestry District taxes upon this land.

tion, I ask unanimous consent to

introduce a bill.
