SENATE

January 11, 1945.

The Senate was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Reverend John Poole of Gardiner.

Journal of yesterday read and approved.

Order

(Out of Order)

On motion by Miss Clough of Penobscot Out of order and under suspension of the rules, it was

ORDERED, the House concurring, that when the Senate and House adjourn, they adjourn to meet on Tuesday, January 16th, 1945, at 4:30 in the afternoon. (S. P. 46)

Sent down for concurrence.

Subsequently the foregoing order was returned from the House, having been read and passed in concurrence.

Papers from the House referred in concurrence.

The following bills were received, and on recommendation by the Committee on Reference of Bills were referred to the following committees:

Banks and Banking

Mr. Dow of Oxford presented Bill "An Act Authorizing Savings Banks, Loan and Building Associations and Trust Companies to Make Mortgage Loans Under the Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944." (S. P. 47)

(500 copies ordered printed.)

Sent down for concurrence.

Judiciary

The same Senator presented Bill "An Act Relating to Laws Passed by the Ninety-second Legislature." (S. P. 48)

(500 copies ordered printed.)

Orders of the Day

On motion by Mr. Welch of Aroostook, the Senate voted to take from the table Joint Order relative to Post War Planning, Joint Select Committee (S. P. 22) tabled by that Senator on January 4 pending passage and on further motion by the same Senator, the Joint Order received passage.

Sent down for concurrence.

Order

On motion by Miss Clough of Penobscot, it was

ORDERED, the House concurring, that the Joint Rules be amended by inserting in the proper alphabetical place in the list of Committees in Section 1, the words "On University of Maine." (S. P. 49)

Sent down for concurrence.

Subsequently the foregoing order was returned from the House, having been read and passed in concurrence.

On motion by Miss Clough of Penobscot

Recessed until ten-thirty.

Order

On motion by Miss Clough of Penobscot, it was

ORDERED, that a message be sent to the House of Representatives proposing a convention of both branches of the Legislature to be held forthwith in the Hall of the House for the purpose of extending to his Excellency, the Governor, an invitation to attend the Convention and make such communication as pleases him, and for the further purpose of administering to James L. Woodbury, Councillor-elect, the oaths required by the Constitution to enable him to enter upon the discharge his official duties.

The Secretary delivered the message and subsequently reported that he had performed the duty assigned to him.

Subsequently a message was received from the House by Mr. Pease, its Clerk, concurring in the proposition for a joint convention for the purpose of extending an invitation to his Excellency, the Governor, to attend the Convention and make such communication as he may be pleased to make, and for the further purpose of administering to James L. Woodbury, Councillor-elect, the oaths required by the Constitution to enable him to enter upon the discharge of his official duties.

The Senate retired to the Hall of the House of Representatives where a joint Convention was formed.

In the Senate:
The Senate was called to order
by the President.

From the House:
Joint Order; relating to New
Joint Committee to be appointed on
Aeronautics. (S. P. 23)
(In the Senate on January 4th,
read and passed.)

Comes from the House, passed as
amended by House Amendment
"A."

In the Senate, that Body voted
to recede from its former action
taken on January 4; House Amend-
ment A was read and adopted in
concurrence and the Order as so
amended was passed in concur-
rence.

The President announced the
nomination of the following mem-
bers on the part of the Senate to
Joint Standing Committees on:

Welfare

Senators Good of Aroostook
Smith of Knox
Boucher of Androscoggin

University of Maine

Washburn of Washington
Welch of Aroostook
Denny of Lincoln

There being no objection, the
nominations were confirmed.

On motion by Mr. Smith of Knox
Adjourned until next Tuesday
afternoon at four-thirty o'clock.
