SENATE

Wednesday, January 17, 1945.

The Senate was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Reverend Weston Holman of Hallowell.

Journal of yesterday read and approved.

Papers from the House referred in concurrence.

The following bills and resolves were received and on recommendation by the Committee on Reference of Bills were referred to the following committes:

Mr. Cleaves of Cumberland presented "Resolve in Favor of Laurence Dresser, of Portland." (S. P. 53)

Orders

On motion by Miss Clough of

Penobscot, it was ORDERED, the House concurring, that all matters pertaining to advertising, committee record binders, paper supplies and rubber stamps be referred to the Superintendent of Public Printing, who shall handle such matters under the direction of the Secretary of the Senate and Clerk of the House. (S. P. 52)

Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by the same Senator, it was

ORDERED, the House concurring, that no bill for private or special legislation be received by this legislature after four o'clock in the afternoon of Wednesday, January 31st, 1945, and that no other bill or resolve be received by this legislature after four o'clock on the af-ternoon of Wednesday, February 7th, 1945, except by unanimous consent in the body in which it is introduced, and it was further

ORDERED, that any bill or resolve which shall be received in either body of this Legislature by unanimous consent, after the times above set, shall stand referred to the Ninety-Third Legislature if unanimous consent for its reception is not given in the other body in concurrence. This order shall not apply to bills reported by any joint standing or joint select committee, in the regular course of business nor to such bills and resolves as are intended only to facilitate the business of the Ninety-second Legisla-ture; and it was further

ORDERED, that the Secretary of the Senate cause a copy of this order to be published in all the daily and weekly papers of the State, commencing January 23, 1945, and continuing up to and including February 7th, 1945. (S. P. 60)

Orders of the Day

On motion by Mr. Spear of Cumberland, the Senate voted to take from the table Order relative to Committee on Post War Planning (H. P. 3) tabled by that Senator on January 4 pending passage in concurrence.

Mr. SPEAR of Cumberland: Mr. President, the purpose for which this Order was introduced having been accomplished, I now move it be indefinitely postponed. The motion prevailed and the

Order was indefinitely postponed in non-concurrence.

On motion by Miss Clough of Penobscot, the Senate voted to take from the table Report from the Maine Development Commission re Post War Planning (S. P. 27) tabled by that Senator on January 9 pending reference; and on further motion by the same Senator, the Com-

munication and Report were referred to the Committee on Post War Planning.
