**SENATE**

Tuesday, February 27, 1945.

The Senate was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Reverend Charles McElhiney of Gardiner.

Journal of Friday, February 23, 1945, read and approved.

Paper from the House referred in concurrence.

From the House:

**Joint Order**

ORDERED, the Senate concurring, that there be prepared after final adjournment under the direction of the Clerk of the House a Register of all Bills and Resolves acted upon by the Legislature showing titles, paper numbers and document numbers, if printed, names of members introducing same, committees to which referred and the final disposition of each; and that there be printed 600 copies of the same for distribution under the direction of the Clerk of the House. (H. P. 1310)

In the House, read and passed.

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Brown of Aroostook, tabled pending passage in concurrence.

**House Committee Reports**

The Committee on Legal Affairs on Bill "An Act Relating to Registration for Professional Engineers," (H. P. 967) (L. D. 584) reported that the same ought to pass.

The same Committee on Bill "An Act Relating to Exception to the Licensing of Steam Engineers and Firemen," (H. P. 830) (L. D. 435) reported that the same ought to pass.

The same Committee on Bill "An Act to Incorporate the Islesboro Associates," (H. P. 827) (L. D. 442) reported that the same ought to pass.

Which reports were severally read and accepted in concurrence, the bills read once and tomorrow assigned for second reading.

The same Committee on Bill "An Act Relating to Town Manager Form of Government," (H. P. 971) (L. D. 548) reported that the same ought to pass as amended by Committee Amendment "A".

Which report was read and accepted in concurrence and the bill was given its first reading; Committee Amendment "A" was read and adopted in concurrence, and the bill as so amended was tomorrow assigned for second reading.

**Order**

On motion by Mr. Washburn of Washington, it was

ORDERED, that the use of the Senate Chamber be granted to the Farmers' Club for Wednesday evening, February 28, 1945.

Bill "An Act to Provide for the Surrender by Town of Trescott of Its Organization." (S. P. 154) (L. D. 372)

Bill "An Act Relating to the Fire and Police Commission for the Town of Skowhegan." (S. P. 251) (L. D. 633)

Which bills were severally read a second time and passed to be engrossed.
