Wednesday, February 28, 1945

The Senate was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the R Sanford of Augusta. the Reverend Lewis

Journal of vesterday read and approved.

From the House: Bill "An Act Relating to Local Rehabilitation of Veterans." (S. P. 147 (L. D. 353)

(In the Senate on February 20th, passed to be engrossed as amended by Committee Amendment "A".)

Comes from the House, Committee Amendment "A" indefinitely post-poned, and the bill passed to be engrossed as amended by House Amendment "A" in non-concurrence.

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Batchelder of York, that Body voted to recede from its former action taken on February 20, whereby the bill was passed to be engrossed as amended by Committee Amendment A; Committee Amendment A was indefinitely postponed in concurrence, House Amendment A was adopted in concurrence, and the bill as amended by House Amendment A was passed to be engrossed in concurrence.

Which reports were severally read and accepted in concurrence, the bills and resolves read once and tomorrow assigned for second reading.

Orders of the Day

On motion by Mr. Dunbar of Washington, the Senate voted to take from the table Senate Report "Ought to Pass in New Draft (S. P. 363)" from the Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game on bill An Act Relating to Free Hunting and Fishing Permits for Veterans, (S. P. 54) (L. D. 22) tabled by that Senator on February 16, pending acceptance of the report; and on further motion by the same Senator, the report of the committee was accepted and the bill in new draft was laid upon the table for printing under the joint rules.

On motion by Mr. Brown of Aroostook, the Senate voted to take from the table Senate Report "Ought to Pass as amended by Committee Amendment A" from the Committee on Legal Affairs on bill An Act to Regulate the Practice of Architecture and Create a Board to Provide for the Examination and Registration of Architects (S. P. 103) (L. D. 178) tabled by that Senator on February 20 pending acceptance of the report; and on further motion by the same Senator, the report of the committee was accepted and the bill was given its first reading.

The Secretary read Committee Amendment A:

"Committee Amendment A to Senate Paper 103, Legislative Document 178, bill An Act to Regulate the Practice of Architecture and Create a Board to Provide for the Examination and Registration of Architects.

"Amend said bill by striking out all of the second paragraph of Section 17 thereof."

Committee Amendment A was adopted, and the bill as amended by Committee Amendment A was tomorrow assigned for second reading.

On motion by Mr. Boucher of Androscoggin, the Senate voted to take from the table bill An Act Relating to the Chief Engineer and Assistant of the City of Lewiston (H. P. 428) (L. D. 236) tabled by that Senator on February 27 pending assignment for second reading; and on further motion by the same Senator, the bill was tomorrow assigned for second reading.

On motion by Mr. Brown of Aroostook, the Senated voted to take from the table bill An Act to Remove Floating Islands in Corundell Lake in Corinna (H. P. 1255) (L. D. 880) tabled by that Senator on February 21 pending reference in concurrence; and on further motion by the same Senator, the bill was referred to the Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs in concurrence.

Mr. BOUCHER of Androscoggin: Mr. President, may I request of the Senator from Aroostook, Senator Brown, through the Chair, that the fourth tabled matter, L. D. 346 which was tabled by that Senator at my request, be now taken from the table?

The PRESIDENT: The Chair assumes that the Senator hears the request.

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Brown of Aroostook, the Senate voted to take from the table Senate Report from the Committee on Judiciary on bill An Act Relating to Appointment of Police Commission for City of Lewiston (S. P. 141) (L. D. 346) that the same be referred to the Committee on Legal Affairs, tabled by that Senator on February 16 pending acceptance of the report; and that Senator yielded to the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Boucher.

On motion by Mr. Boucher of Androscoggin, the report of the committee was accepted and the bill referred to the Committee on Legal Affairs.
