Tuesday, March 6, 1945.

The Senate was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. William R. Wood of Augusta.

"And further amend said bill by striking out in the 4th and 5th lines of said Section 61-A, the underlined words or a baptismal record containing like information."

"And further amend said bill by striking out in Section 61-B, in the 6th line thereof the underlined

6th line thereof, the underlined words 'or baptism'; and by striking out in the same line the underlined figure '10,' and inserting in place thereof the underlined figure '60.'

"And further amend said bill by striking out in Section 61-D, in the 2nd and 3rd lines thereof, the un-derlined words, 'penalty or forfeiture has been incurred by reason of

refusal or unreasonable neglect,' and inserting in place thereof the underlined words parent or guardian has unreasonably refused or neglected'."
