Orders of the Day

Mr. BROWN of Aroostook: Mr. President, it seems our table is getting rather heavy, especially with the addition of several new bills today. While we do not like to take things off at this time, still it is getting late in the session and most of the members are present and I am going to ask permission to take from the table the second tabled matter, tabled by me on February 27th.

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Brown of Aroostook, the Senate voted to take from the table, Joint Order Relative to Register of Bills with Final Disposition at Time of Adjournment (H. P. 1310) tabled by that Senator on February 27th pending consideration.

Mr. BROWN of Aroostook: Mr. President, I will just simply explain why I placed this on the table—a brief explanation. This is calling for a register of bills, with the final disposition at time of adjournment. In other words, a record of bills and what became of them. I, personally never had any interest in bills unless they were my own that were killed and I always had a copy of the bill in my possession that I could take home with me. We have a complete record of all bills passed, of course, in our statutes, and we have a complete record of everything transpiring in the legislature and what became of the bills in our stenographic record which we get sooner or later. I have talked with several members of the Senate, not all of them, as to what the value would be and I have not talked with anyone who thought it would be of any particular value.

I went to the printer and asked about the cost and he said the cost would be in the neighborhood four hundred dollars-rather more than four hundred dollars, and that doesn't take into account the cost that would be incurred in the office of the Clerk and his help which would have to be here after the session to compile the data.

I move this order be indefinitely postponed. I ask the members, if they think it is worth that money to vote for it, and if they don"t think it is worth that, they can vote against it.

Mr. LEAVITT Mr. LEAVITT of Cumberland: Mr. President and Members of the Senate, I hesitate to get up once again on the opposite side to my colleague, the Senator from Aroostook, Senator Brown, but this was my suggestion in the first place. The Legislative Record for the 1943 session arrived in my office over the week-end—last week-end. It is a little less than two years and a half -about two years and two months late.

I thoroughly realize if people ask about certain bills could go through the Legislative Record, if I could remember two years later they had asked me to do so

This record here would allow us to quickly put our hands on what happened to bills, and unlike Senator Brown, I am interested in a great many bills that go through here that do not originate in my own brain. In fact, I am interested in any bill my friend, Senator Brown might put in here. I cannot remember all these bills but I would like to know what happens to them.

In the past — I have been here two sessions and I have said to myself, I would like to know what the legislature did while I was there but I know it is impossible out of the maze of legislative documents, amendments 'A' and amend-ments 'B' and so forth and so on to ever be able to reconstruct just what did happen. I believe this little register here which will cost us less than half the salary of any one of us while we are here, will be of great value. I do not think we realize how much we will use it if we finally have it. I know this book which is published half way through the session is of tremendous value to us. I believe if we coud have a final copy of what we accomplish here and telling where we can refer to it and telling what happened, I think it will be of tremendous value.

I am not going to make an impassioned plea for it, but I hope the motion of the Senator from Aroostook, Senator Brown, does not prevail.

Mr. BROWN: Mr. President, just one word that I overlooked saying, is the fact the register as we have it now and would have it at the final end, simply gives the title of bills and we have a great many bills on the same subject matter and a great many bills with the same title, and even with the Register you have got to look up in the Legislative Documents what the bills are, and it appears to me it is not a great deal of advantage.

The PRESIDENT: The question is on the motion of the Senator from Aroostook, Senator Brown, that the order be indefinitely postponed.
