Due to indefinitely postponed. the absence of a number of those who voted on this measure yesterday and who are vitally interested, I move this matter be tabled and especially assigned for next Tues-

The motion prevailed and the bill was laid upon the table pending the motion to reconsider the action whereby the bill was in-definitely postponed, and especially assigned for Tuesday next.

On motion by Mr. Cross of Kennebec, the Senate voted to take from the table, Bill, An Act Re-lating to Animal Husbandry (S. P. 233) (L. D. 651) tabled by that Senator on March 21st pending passage to be engrossed.

Mr. CROSS of Kennebec: President and members of the Senate: this is a very small bill and doesn't involve very much money. My only reason for tabling it and the only reason I speak on it now the only reason I speak on it now is because it seemed to me the bill called for a very small amount of money to be passed as an emergency. I think sometimes we pass bills out as emergencies which could very properly wait a reasonable time for the law to go into effect

I have had some conversation with the Department of Agriculture and with Mr. Mossman, and through some legal quirk in the law as written, it seems they could not get this through the contingent fund without causing some switching in the earmarked money which must be spent for that purpose. I therefore consider it is not a very stringent emergency but as that is about all the objection I have, I move it

be passed to be engrossed.

The motion prevailed and the bill was passed to be engrossed. Sent down for concurrence.
