On motion by Mr. Bowker of Portland, it was

**ORDERED**, that Mr. Emerson of North Haven be excused from attendance because of illness.

The **SPEAKER**: Pursuant to the House Order which was passed on January 1, the Speaker appoints Lawrence R. Moore, of Augusta, as House Page.

Pursuant to the order passed today, the Speaker will appoint John C. Carey, of Hallowell, Assistant Doorkeeper.

The Chair understands that there are three vacancies on the part of the House of Representatives on the Maine Commission for Interstate Cooperation. Under the provisions of Revised Statutes of Maine, 1944, Chapter 9, Sections 34 to 39 inclusive, to fill these vacancies the Chair now appoints the gentleman from Bangor, Mr. Atherton as a member of the Commission to fill the vacancy created by the fact that the former representative from Scarborough, Mr. Baker, is not now a member of this body; the Chair appoints the gentleman from Houlton, Mr. Robbins, as a member of the Commission to fill the vacancy created by the fact that the former representative from Farmington, Mr. Crosby, is not now a member of this body; and the Chair appoints the gentleman from Rockland, Mr. Sleeper, as a member of the Commission to fill the vacancy created by the fact that the former representative from Rumford, Mr. Poulin, is not now a member of this body.
