Report was read and accepted, and the Bill, having already been printed, was read twice under suspension of the rules.

Committee Amendment "A" read by the Clerk as follows:

Committee Amendment "A" to H. P. 32, L. D. 27, Bill "An Act Polating to Penalty for Night Hunting."

Amend said bill by striking out all after "\$50" in the 9th line thereof, and inserting in place thereof the following: 'not less than \$100 and costs, nor more than \$200 and costs, which fine and costs shall not be suspended, and an additional penalty of not more than 30 days in jail, at the discretion of the court; and for a 2nd or subsequent offense, by a fine of not less than \$200 and costs, nor more than \$400 and costs, which fine and costs shall not be suspended, and an additional penalty of not more than 60 days in jail, at the discretion of the court.'

Committee Amendment "A" was adopted, and the Bill was assigned for third reading the next legislative day.
