"Committee Amendment A to S. P. 41, L. D. 15, bill An Act Relating to Trustee Process Against Banks. Amend said bill by adding at the end of the first paragraph of the part designated Section 5 thereof, the following sentence: 'Service may be made on the manager of such banking institution in the county having jurisdiction over the parties named in the action'."

Which amendment was adopted, and the bill was tomorrow assigned for second reading.
