On motion by Mr. Barnes of Aroostook, the Senate voted to take from the table bill An Act Relating to Trustee Process Against Banks (S. P. 41) (L. D. 15) tabled by that Senator on January 29 pending passage to be engrossed; and on further motion by the same Senator, the bill was passed to be engrossed.

On motion by Mr. Morrill of Cumberland, the Senate voted to take from the table Resolve Directing Commissioner of Sea and Shore Fisheries to make Study of Life and Habits of Seals (S. P. 118) tabled by that Senator on January 29 pending reference to a committee; and that

Mr. CROSS of Kennebec: Mr.
President and members of the Senate, I would like to make a slight explanation in regard to this resolve and the reference suggested by the Committee on Reference of Bills.

I will call your attention first to the language I just used which is "suggested by the Committee on Reference of Bills." There is nothing sacred about any suggestion that we might make, and being human we try not to be wrong. Some of these bills are obvious at the start as to their purpose. Some of them are rather obscure and the suggestion of the Committee on Reference of Bills in regard to this is due to the fact that it might incur an appropriation from the General Fund so we suggested that it go to the Committee on Appropriations. However, on perusing this resolve a little more closely it seems to be rather technical in nature and directly involves the Committee on Sea and Shore Fisheries. I would move, therefore, that this resolve be referred to the Committee on Sea and Shore Fisheries.

Thereupon, the resolve was referred to the Committee on Sea and Shore Fisheries and ordered printed. Sent down for concurrence.
