ORDERED, that the said Revisor shall file a list of the titles of Private and Special Acts, the data for which is in his hands at that time with the Secretary of the Senate

and Clerk of the House. (S. P. 187) Sent down for concurrence.

Senate Committee Report

Mr. Dunbar from the Committee on Judiciary on Bill "An Act Relating to Jurisdiction of Supreme Judicial Court." (S. P. 70) (L. D. 64) reported that the same ought to pass as amended by Committee Amendment "A".

Which report was read and adopted, and the bill read once; Committee Amendment "A" was read:

"Committee Amendment A to Senate Paper 70, Legislative Document 64, Bill An Act Relating to Jurisdiction of Supreme Judicial Court. Amend said bill by striking out in the 9th line of that part designated Section 5 thereof, the words 'otherwise provided by law' and inserting in place therefor the words, 'provided in Section I and II of Chapter 95'."

Committee Amendment A was adopted, and the bill as so amended was tomorrow assigned for second reading.

Passed to be Engrossed

Bill "An Act Permitting the Building of a Bridge Between Burnt Island and Spruce Head Island." (H. P. 117) (L. D. 81)

Which bill was read a second time and passed to be engrossed.
