Mr. DUBE: Mr. President, I now move that we reconsider our action of yesterday whereby the Senate accepted the "Ought Not to Pass" report of the Committee on Legal Affairs. I am making this motion for the purpose of having an amendment drawn which I think will be satisfactory and I hope my motion prevails. I intended to table this matter yesterday.

Thereupon, the Senate voted to reconsider its action of yesterday whereby the "Ought Not to Pass" report of the Committee on Legal Affairs was adopted.

On further motion by the same Senator, the report and accompanying papers were laid upon the table pending adoption of the report.

Mr. WILLIAMS of Penobscot: Mr. President, I would like to inquire if Senate Paper 33, Legislative Docu-ment 416, bill An Act Relating to Reinstatement of Dismissed State Employees is in the possession of the Senate?

The PRESIDENT: The Chair will state that it is.

Mr. WILLIAM3: Mr. President and Members of the Senate, I would like to move for a reson-sideration due to the keen interest in this matter and the fact that the vote of this Body yesterday for indefinite postponement was 15 to 14. I do not make this motion with any idea of changing my vote but I think very strong evidence will be offered in debate and I would like to give all the Senators a chance to vote on this matter and for all interested to be heard.

Mr. WELCH of Aroostook:

President, in fairness to the Senators who voted with me yesterday I feel it is only fair that we should take another vote on this matter this morning by division and therefore when the vote is taken I ask for a division.

The PRESIDENT: The question before the Senate is on the motion of the Senater from Penobscot, Senator Williams, that the Senate reconsider its action of yesterday whereby the "Ought to Pass" report was indefinitely postponed. Is the Senate ready for the question?

A division of the Senate was had. 11 having voted in the affirmative and 14 opposed, the motion to reconsider did not prevail.

On motion by Mr. Barnes of Aroostcok the Senate voted to take from the table Bill, "An Act to Validate the Use of Check Marks in Elections (S. P. 144) (L. D. 339) tabled by that Senator on February 26th pending adoption of Senate Amendment "A"; and on further motion by the same Senator, Senate Amendment "A" was adopted and the bill as so amended was passed to be engressed.
