SENATE

Friday, February 28, 1947 The Senate was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Reverend Edna Knowlton of Augusta.

Journal of yesterday read and approved.

On motion by Mr. Cross of Kennebec, out of order and under suspension of the rules, it was

ORDERED, the House concurring, that when the Senate and House adjourn, they adjourn to meet on Tuesday, March 4th, 1947, at eleventhirty o'clock in the forenoon. (S. P. 414)
