Mr. BOUTIN of Androscoggin: Mr. President and members of the Senate, I would like to introduce a resolve in favor of Sacred Heart Convent of Jackman, Maine. I shall try briefly to explain what the resolve is. On February 24th the Sacred Heart Convent burned down and was a total loss. In this resolve I am asking for an appropriation of \$100,000 to help them rebuild. As you all know the total loss was \$250,000 and to rebuild the Convent will cost approximately half a million dollars. With your kind approval, I would like to present this Resolve and move its acceptance.
