Mr. CROSS of Kennebec: Mr. President and Members of the Senate, I tabled this bill some weeks ago because there was another measure in the process of going through which would repeal the act in regard to farm land loans. This act went through yesterday for final enactment and I presume the Governor has it in his possession and will probably sign it. So this bill here is completely unnecessary and I therefore move that it be indefinitely postponed.

The motion prevailed and the bill was indefinitely postponed in non-concurrence.
