Thursday, March 13, 1947

The Senate was called to order by the President

Prayer by the Reverend Tom G. Akeley of Gardiner.

Thereupon, Senate Amendment "B" was adopted and the bill as amended by Senate Amendment "A" and by Senate Amendment "B" was passed to be engrossed. Sent down for concurrence.
