SENATE

Monday, April 7, 1947. The Senate was called to order by

the President. Prayer by the Reverend Gordon Washburn of Hallowell.

Journal of Friday, April 4th, 1947, read and approved.

Bill "An Act to Create the Castle Hill-Chapman-Mapleton Community School District." (H. P. 1465) (L. D. 1069)

(In the Senate on March 31, 1947, passed to be engrossed as amended by Committee Amendment "A" in concurrence.)

Comes from the House, engrossing reconsidered; House Amendment "A" was adopted, and the bill as amended by Committee Amendment "A" and by House Amendment "A" was passed to be engrossed in non-concurrence.

In the Senate on motion by Mr. Cross of Kennebec, the Senate voted to recede from its former action whereby the bill was passed to be engrossed; House Amendment A was adopted in concurrence, and the bill as amended by Committee Amendment A and House Amendment A was passed to be engrossed in concurrence.

The same Committee on Bill "An Act Repealing Mount Bigelow Game Preserve in Franklin and Somerset Counties," (H. P. 899) (L. D. 598) reported that the same ought to pass.

The Committee on Judiciary on Bill "An Act Relating to Method of Payment of Alimony," (H. P. 917) (L. D. 614) reported that the same ought to pass.

Which reports were severally read and adopted in concurrence, the bills and resolves read once and tomorrow assigned for second reading.

The Committee on Temperance on Bill "An Act Relating to Publication of Applications for Liquor Licenses," (H. P. 1567) (L. D. 1196) reported that the same ought to pass as amended by Committee Amendment "A"

Which report was read and adopted in concurrence and the bill read once; Committee Amendment "A" was read and adopted in concurrence, and the bill as amended was tomorrow assigned for second reading.

The Committee on Sea and Shore Fisheries on Bill "An Act Relating to the Digging of Clams for Commercial Purposes in the Towns of Waldoboro and Bremen," (H. P. 1320) (L. D. 917) reported that the same ought to pass.

In the Senate, the report was read and adopted and the bill was given its first reading. Thereupon on motion by Mr. Boucher of Androscoggin, the report and accompanying papers were laid upon the table pending consideration of the amendment.

P. 442) (L. D. 1235) reported that the same ought to pass.

Mr. Boucher from the Committee on Temperance on Bill "An Act Relating to Privileges of Club Liquor Licenses," (S. P. 411) (L. D. 1159) reported that the same ought to pass.

Mr. Baker from the same Committee on Bill "An Act Relating to Control of the Sale of Alcohol," (S. P. 429) (L. D. 1214) reported that the same ought to pass.

Mr. Welch from the Committee on Ways and Bridges on Bill "An Act Relating to Permits for Digging into and Opening Streets and Highways," (S. P. 165) (L. D. 404) reported that the same ought to pass.
