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Friday, April 11, 1947.

Mr. HOPKINS of Kennebec: Mr. President, insofar as I know, I am the only native of North Haven who has a membership in the Sen-ate. For that reason, I have been asked to say a word about this bill, so that the Senators may know the reasons for it.

North Haven is an island situated, as you know, in Penobscot Bay. Years ago, it had a very extensive lines service. Several steamship lines served the island, but in re-cent years it has had no boat service at all.

In a recent legislative session, the so called North Haven Boat District formed, and the Town was authorized to purchase and operate its own boat.

The question now arises as to the competition which airplane service gives to the municipally-owned boat service, and this bill provides for an amendment to the port authority, so that service can have at least a chance with competitive air service.

I know nothing of the merits of the bill, except to know that if air-lines are permitted to serve the island without any restrictions at all, they will seriously reduce the profit which the boat line may be able to make for the Town, and perhaps make it almost impossible for the Town to maintain boat service.

For that reason, I think that the bill should be accepted, in order that some committee of the legislature may give it due consideration. Therefore, I move that the Senate concur unanimously with the action of the House in receiving this bill and referring it to the Committee on Legal Affairs.

Thereupon the bill was received by unanimous consent and referred to the Committee on Legal Affairs in concurrence.

Mr. CROSS of Kennebec: Mr. President, may I inquire if there is in the possession of the Senate Resolve Providing for an Additional State Pension for George H. Babb of Augusta (H. P. 1445) (L. D. 1322). The PRESIDENT: The Chair will

state that the resolve is in the possession of the Senate having been recalled from the office of the Governor by joint order.

Thereupon, on motion by the same Senator, the rules were suspended and the Senate voted to re-consider its former action whereby the resolve was finally passed; and further reconsider its action whereby the resolve was passed to be engrossed.

Mr. CROSS: Mr. President and members of the Senate, this resolve was passed to be enacted without provision being made as to the fund from which the pension would be drawn. In order to correct this error I present Senate Amendment A and move its adoption:

Mr. CLEAVES of Cumberland: Mr. CLEAVES of Cumberland: Mr. President and members of the Senate I am about to present Senate Amendment A to this bill. Before I do it I would like to say a few words in explanation. This bill authorizes the Governor and Council to convey to people of Baltic origin such lands as they deem advisable. It has been a custom in this legislature for years to hold within its own power the conveyance of state lands, and this amendment merely deletes the words "Governor and Council." and gives the power back to the legislature.

We in the Forestry Committee have fought against that for a long time and we feel it is far better to keep it within the powers of the legislature rather than the Governor and Council. I therefore present Senate Amendment A and move its adoption:

"Senate Amendment A to H. P. 1543, L. D. 1173, bill An Act Setting Aside Certain Lands for Settlement by Displaced Persons of Baltic Origin. Amend said bill by striking out the figure 3 in the second line after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the figure 2 and by striking out in the 3rd line '249-C' and inserting in place thereof the phrase 'and 49-B.' Further amend said bill by striking out all of that paragraph beginning 'Sec. 49-B. Execution of Policy.' Further amend said bill by strik-

Further amend said bill by striking out at the beginning of the 5th paragraph the phrase 'Sec. 49-C' and inserting in place thereof 'Sec. 49-B.' Further amend said paragraph by striking out in the next to the last line thereof the underlined phrase 'public lands owned by the state or'."

Which amendment was adopted and on further motion by the same Senator, the bill as so amended was passed to be engrossed in non-concurrence.
