HOUSE

Friday, January 26, 1951

The gentleman from Cape Elizabeth, Mr. Chase, was granted unanimous consent to address the House.

Mr. CHASE: Mr. Speaker, I have been misunderstood so many times, both at home and abroad, that one more time may make little difference but yesterday, on the calendar, there appeared as introduced by me the so-called state property tax.

From the introduction of that measure, certain newspapers drew erroneous conclusions. The bill was introduced by me in my capacity as House Chairman of the Committee on Taxation, first, because the bill has to be introduced and, second, because, in any event, it may be assumed that the state property tax might be necessary as a method of taxing the unorganized towns.

Therefore, I should like the record to show that the introduction of the measure by me is a technical move in procedure and involves no recommendation whatever on my part.
