ORDERED, the House concurring, that the two bonds of the Honorable Frank S. ORDERED, that all petitions, memorials, papers, bills and resolves shall be deposited in the Senate hopper by one o'clock P.M. of each day in order to be introduced and received in the Senate on the following Legislative day.

On motion by Mr. Collins of Aroostook, it was

ORDERED, the House concurring, that there be paid to the members of the Senate and House as advances on account of compensation established by statute, the amount of eighty-five dollars (\$85.00) fortnightly, according to lists certified to the State Controller by the Secretary of the Senate and Clerk of the House respectively; and that the final pay rolls bear the approval of the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs. On motion by Mr. Dunham of Hancock, it was

ORDERED, that the Committee on Ways and Bridges be granted the use of the Senate Chamber for public hearings each Wednesday during the session, beginning January 21, 1953.
