Mr. Lord from the Committee on Legal Affairs on Bill "An Act to Grant a New Charter to the City of Gardiner" (H. P. 110) (L. D. 118) reported: "Ought to pass" as amended by Committee Amendment "A" submitted therewith.

Report was read and accepted and the Bill read twice.

Committee Amendment "A" was read by the Clerk as follows:

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 110, L. D. 118, Bill "An Act to Grant a New Charter to the City of Gardiner."

Amend said Bill by striking out the 4th paragraph of Article II.

Further amend said Bill by striking out the 1st paragraph of section 3 of Article II and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:

'Sec. 3. Vacancies, forfeiture of office. In case of a vacancy caused by the death, resignation, removal from the city, or removal from office, as hereinafter provided, of any member of the city council, the vacancy shall be filled from the ward in which such vacancy occurs by a majority vote of the remaining members of the council.'

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of section 2 of Article IV and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Sec. 2. Organization, qualification, quorum. The members elected shall be sworn to the faithful discharge of their duties by a justice of the peace or by the city clerk, and a record made thereof. A majority of the whole number elected shall be a quorum and they shall elect their own vice chairman. The mayor shall be chairman ex officio and shall vote only in the case of a tie.'

Further amend said bill by inserting after the word "council" in the 5th line of section 3 of Article V the following words: 'or other elective offices'

Further amend said Bill by striking out of all of subsections (a) and (b) of section 1 of Article VI, and inserting in place thereof the following:

(a) The following officers and boards, except as herein otherwise provided, shall be appointed by the mayor with the advice and consent of the city council in regular session.

- 1. City Manager
- 2. City Clerk
- 3. Trustees of Gardiner Public Library.
- 4. Trustees of Gardiner Water District.
- 5. Superintendent of Cemeteries.

- 6. Superintendent of Parks and Playgrounds.
- 7. Director of Civil Defense.

(b) The following officers and boards shall be appointed by the city manager with the advice and consent of the council:

1. Treasurer.

2. Tax Collector.

3. Chief of Police, special police officers and constables.

4. Chief of the Fire Department.

5. City Solicitor.

6. City Physician.

7. City Auditor.

8. Public Works.

9. Health Officer.

10. All other department heads now existing, or which may be appointed, established through ordinance and resolve.'

Further amend said Bill by inserting before the period at the end of the next to the last sentence of section I of Article VIII the following:

'; but only if the total number of votes cast for and against the acceptance of this act at said election equaled or exceeded 20% of the total vote for all candidates for governor cast in said city at the next previous gubernatorial election.'

Committee Amendment "A" was adopted and the Bill assigned for third reading tomorrow.

Mr. Martin from the Committee on Legal Affairs on Bill "An Act to Provide a Selectman-Manager Form of Government for the Town of Madawaska, in the County of Aroostook" (H. P. 490) (L. D. 552) reported "Ought to pass" as amended by Committee Amendment "A" submitted therewith.

Report was read and accepted and the Bill read twice.

Committee Amendment "A" was read by the Clerk as follows:

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 490, L. D. 552, Bill "An Act to Provide a Selectman-Manager Form of Government for the Town of Madawaska, in the County of Aroostook."

Amend said Bill in Article X by striking out the last sentence of Section 1003 and inserting in place thereof the following sentence: 'An ordinance, resolution or vote so referred shall take effect upon the conclusion of such meeting unless at least 100 electors, constituting a majority of those voting thereon, shall have voted in the negative.'

Further amend said Bill in Article X by striking out the last sentence of subsection (a) of Section 1004 and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:

'Such ordinance shall take effect on the 10th day after the conclusion of such meeting unless a majority of those voting thereon shall have voted in the negative.'

Committee Amendment "A" was adopted and the Bill assigned for third reading tomorrow.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 496, L. D. 540, Bill "An Act relating to Permit Before Examination for Applicant to Practice Hairdressing and Beauty Culture."

Amend said Bill by inserting after the underlined word "culture" at the end of the 4th line the following underlined words:

'who has been a resident of the State of Maine for a period of at least 6 months,'

Further amend said Bill by adding at the end thereof, before the single quotation mark, the following underlined sentence:

'The applicant shall pay to the Board a fee of \$3.'

Committee Amendment "A" was adopted and the Bill assigned for third reading tomorrow.

Committee Amendment "A" was read by the Clerk as follows:

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 497, L. D. 541, Bill "An Act relating to Time of Examinations for Applicants to Practice Hairdressing and Beauty Culture."

Amend said Bill by striking out in the 5th line thereof the stricken out figure "lst" and the underlined figure "2nd", and inserting in place thereof the figure 'lst'.

Further amend said Bill by adding at the end thereof, before the single quotation mark, the following underlined sentence.

'The examination fee paid by the successful applicant at the June examinations shall include the license fee to the next license date.'

Committee Amendment "A" was adopted and the Bill assigned for third reading tomorrow.

Mr. Greenleaf from the Committee on Sea and Shore Fisheries on Bill "An Act Prohibiting Commercial Digging of Clams in Brooklin and Sedgwick, Hancock County" (H. P. 402) (L. D. 418) reported "Ought to pass" as amended by Committee Amendment "A" submitted therewith.

Report was read and accepted and the Bill read twice.

Committee Amendment "A" was read by the Clerk as follows:

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 402, L. D. 418, Bill "An Act Prchibiting Commercial Digging of Clams in Brooklin and Sedgwick, Hancock County."

Amend said Bill by striking out the comma at the end of the 8th line from the end and inserting in place thereof a period.

Further amend said Bill by striking out the 7th line from the end and inserting in place thereof the following: 'Nothing herein shall prohibit a resident or riparian owner of shores or flats in their respective towns from digging and taking onehalf bushel of clams therefrom for food for himself and family.'

This being an emergency measure and a two-thirds vote of all the members elected to the House being necessary, a division was had. 123 voted in favor of same and none against, and accordingly the Bill was passed to be enacted, signed by the Speaker and sent to the Senate.

Orders of the Day

Mr. Ferguson of Hanover was granted unanimous consent to address the House.

Mr. FERGUSON: Mr. Speaker and Members of the House: On January 27 the Joint Standing Committee on Highways was authorized and directed by Joint Order to report to the Legislature such recommendations as seemed proper with respect to the proposed reclassification of highways.

The Committee has considered the proposed reclassification of highways and in executive session unanimously adopted a resolution which I am sending to the desk and request that the Clerk read.

The SPEAKER: If there is no objection, the Clerk will read the resolution of the Joint Committee. The Chair hears no objection.

Thereupon, in accordance with Joint Order (S. P. 105) directing the Committee on Highways to make recommendations and report to the Legislature, Mr. Ferguson of Hanover presented the following resolution which the Clerk was directed to read:

The CLERK: Resolution adopted by the Joint Standing Committee on Highways re proposed reclassification of highways.

WHEREAS the Legislative Committee on Highways has carefully considered the report of the State Highway Commission made available to each member of the 97th Legislature wherein the Commission discusses five possible plans for the administration of the state aid highway system; and

WHEREAS the Committee has had to weigh the provisions contained in these five plans and the effect of the plans upon the municipalities of the State, and

WHEREAS the Committee believes that it is not desirable to increase the cost for maintenance or construction of highways at the local level; and

WHEREAS the Committee believes that many municipalities could not undertake the needed improvement to rural highways under Plans 2, 3, 4, and 5;

Be it resolved that the Committee recommends to the 97th Legislature the adoption of Plan 1, with the provision that any town which so desires may apply to the State Highway Commission for reclassification of any part of its state aid highway system.

(Off record remarks by the Speaker)

The SPEAKER: The House is proceeding under Orders of the Day.

Thereupon, on motion of the gentleman from Bremen, Mr. Hilton, the House voted to take from the table the fourth tabled and unassigned matter, Bill "An Act relating to Willful Concealment of Merchancise in Stores" (H. P. 861) (L. D. 881) tabled on February 24 by said gentleman pending third reading; on further motion of the same gentleman, the Bill was given its third reading, passed to be engrossed and sent to the Senate.

The SPEAKER: The House is proceeding under Orders of the Day.

The Chair would call to the attention of the House the fact that a resolution memorializing Congress to call a convention for the purpose of considering an amendment to the Constitution of the United States relative to the administration by the several states of their respective school systems, and for other purposes, has been received from the Secretary of State of the State of Georgia.
