SENATE

Friday, April 5, 1957

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. Alfred Ives of Gardiner.

On motion of Mr. Davis of Cumberland, Journal of yesterday read and approved.

On metion by Mr. Low of Knox, out of order and under suspension of the rules:

ORDERED, the House concurring, that when the Senate and House adjourn, they adjourn to meet on Tuesday, April 9, 1957, in the forencon. (S. P. 507)

Which was read and passed.

Sent forthwith to the House.

Subsequently, the foregoing Order was returned from the House, having been read and passed in concurrence.
