SENATE

Friday, April 12, 1957

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. Harvey F. Ammerman of Augusta.

On motion by Mr. Ferguson of Oxford, Journal of yesterday read and approved.

Mr. Bailey of Sagadahoc was granted unanimous consent to address the Senate.

Mr. BAILEY of Sagadahoc: Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I wish to address the Senate for a few moments. In the absence of Senator Charles of Cumberland, who, as I understand made this presentation I wish to state that the poultry business in Maine has reached the number one position in agricultural enterprise in terms of cash receipts from products marketed. In 1955, 66 million dollars was derived from poultry products alone, representing 37 per cent of Maine's total agricultural income. Of this amount, Maine has sold

55,917,000 doz. eggs 33,438,000 commercial broilers 3,966,000 farm chickens 260,000 turkeys

The important features in the development of this industry has been the great opportunity open in Maine for production facilities, top quality and promotional efforts of the industry. There are eight modern poultry processing plants in the State employing about 1,200 persons with a weekly payroll of about \$85,-000. Approximately one million broilare processed weekly shipped to markets in all New England States, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania and Washington, D. C. as major markets. In the Maine market, much of the increase in consumption and sale has been contributed to the efforts of the Maine Department of Agriculture Maine State Grocers Association and Maine Poultry Associates for their part in conducting Poultry and Eggs merchandising schools for wholesalers and retailers and other

In acknowledging this number one Maine agricultural enterprise, the Senate has been graced this afternoon with a suitable and useable product, a Maine broiler through the courtesy of the Fort Halifax Packing Co. for your taste and pleasure.

Also, ladies and gentlemen, I want to remind you that this is simply an appetizer for what we are going to be called upon to partake of on April 30th in the Augusta State Armory.

The PRESIDENT: On behalf of the Senate the Chair thanks the industry and thanks the Senator from Sagadahoc, Senator Bailey.

The Chair notes to the Senate that since this is the final day of Aroostook Week in this Legislature, there could be no more fitting climax to that Aroostook Week than the action of the Chair in asking the Senator from Aroostook, Senator Rogerson along with his colleague, the Senator from Aroostook, Senator Reed, jointly escort to the Chair one of the very attractive ladies from Aroostook County.

Mrs. John Reed was thereupon escorted to the rostrum by the Senator from Aroostook, Senator Rogerson and the Senator from Aroostook, Senator Reed, amid the applause of the Senate, the members rising.

On motion by Mr. Low of Knox, out of order and under suspension of the rules,
