Mr. WOODCOCK of Penobscot: Mr. President, I would inquire if Senate Paper 21 Joint Order Relative to Advances on Account of Compensation for Members is in the possession of the Senate?

The PRESIDENT: It is.

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Woodcock of Penobscot, the Senate voted to reconsider its former action whereby said Joint Order received passage; the same Senator presented Senate Amendment A and moved its adoption:

"Senate Amendment A to S. P. 21. Amend said Order by striking out in the fourth line thereof the

words and figures '\$120 fortnightly' and inserting in place thereof the words and figures '\$140 fortnightly'".

Which order received a passage in non-concurrence.
