SENATE

Thursday, January 29, 1959

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. Robert L. Smith of Augusta.

On motion by Mr. Dunn of Augusta, Journal of yesterday read and approved.

Order

On motion by Mr. Woodcock of Penobscot, out of order and under suspension of the rules:

ORDERED, the House concurring, that when the Senate and House adjourn, they adjourn to meet on Tuesday, February 3, at ten o'clock in the forenoon. (S. P. 126)
