SENATE

Monday, June 1, 1959

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. Royal Brown of Gardiner.

On motion by Mr. Parker of Piscataquis,

Journal of last Friday read and approved.

Papers from the House

"Resolve Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution for Appointment of Attorney General by the Governor with Consent of the Senate." (S. P. 85) (L. D. 435)

Comes from the House, indefinitely postponed.

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Hillman of Penobscot, the Senate voted to insist on its previous action and request a Committee of Conference. The President appointed as Senate conferees Senators: Hillman of Penobscot, Ross of Sagadahoc, Lessard of Androscoggin.

Bill, "An Act Increasing Salary of Members of the Legislature." (H. P. 15) (L. D. 24)

In Senate on May 28, indefinitely postponed in non-concurrence.

Comes from the House, that body having insisted upon its former action whereby the bill was passed to be engrossed as amended by House Amendment A (Filing 61), now asks for Committee of Conference.

Senate Committee Reports Ought to Pass

Mr. Duquette from the Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs on

Bill, "An Act Creating a Committee to Study Establishment of Vocational Facilities for the Mentally III and Retarded." (S. P. 226) (L. D. 970) reported that the same Ought to Pass.

Which report was read and accepted and the bill read once. Under suspension of the rules, the bill was read a second time and passed to be engrossed.

Ought to Pass - as Amended

Mr. Pierce, from the same Committee on Bill, "An Act to Reactivate a Maine Committee on Problems of the Mentally Retarded." (S. P. 195) (L. D. 538) reported that the same Ought to Pass as amended by Committee Amendment A.

Which report was read and accepted and the bill read once. Committee Amendment A was read and adopted, and under suspension of the rules, the bill was read a second time and passed to be engrossed.

Enactors

The Committee on Engrossed Bills reported as truly and strictly engrossed, the following bills and resolves:

Bill, "An Act Relating to Standards of Quality in Egg Grading law." (H. P. 762) (L. D. 762)

Bill, "An Act Amending the Maine Housing Authorities Act." (H. P. 967) (L. D. 1373)

(On motion by Mr. Charles of Cumberland, tabled pending passage to be enacted and especially assigned for Wednesday next.)

Which bills were severally passed to be enacted.

"Resolve Providing Matching Funds for Federal National Defense Education Allotments." (H. P. 580) (L. D. 827)

On motion by Mr. Rogerson of Aroostook, the resolve was placed on the Special Appropriations Table pending final passage.

"Resolve Providing Funds for a Referral Center at Farmington State Teacher's College for Assistance to Teachers." (H. P. 711) (L. D. 1016)

(On motion by Mr. Rogerson of Aroostook, the resolve was placed on the Special Appropriations Table pending final passage.)

"Resolve Appropriating Moneys to Town of Robbinston for Development of Recreational Areas." (S. P. 362) (L. D. 1045)

(On motion by Mr. Rogerson of Aroostook, the resolve was placed on the Special Appropriations Table pending final passage.)

"Resolve Authorizing Aeronautic Commission to Conduct an A u g u sta-Waterville Airport Survey." (S. P. 501) (L. D. 1383) Which resolve was finally passed.

Orders of the Day

The President laid before the Senate the 1st tabled and today assigned item being bill, "An Act Relating to Weekly Benefits for Total Unemployment under Employment Security Law." (H. P. 969) (L. D. 1378) tabled on May 29 by the Senator from Sagadahoc, Senator Ross pending passage to be engrossed; and that Senator moved that the bill be passed to be engrossed.

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Lessard of Androscoggin, the bill was laid upon the table pending motion by Mr. Ross of Sagadahoc that the bill be passed to be engrossed in non-concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Woodcock of Penobscot, the Senate voted to take from the table the 18th table item being bill, "An Act Directing a Study of Property Tax Administration" (S. P. 129) (L. D. 324) tabled by that Senator on May 21 pending motion by Senator Pierce of Hancock to recede and concur.

Thereupon, Mr. Pierce of Hancock was granted permission to withdraw his motion; and on motion by Mr. Woodcock of Penobscot, the Senate voted to insist on its former action and ask for a Committee of Conference. The President named as Senate conferees, Senators Rogerson of Aroostook, Woodcock of Penobscot and Lessard of Androscoggin.

Mr. Lessard of Androscoggin was granted unanimous consent to address the Senate.

Mr. LESSARD: Mr. President and members of the Senate: One of our members today is enjoying and celebrating a birthday. I spoke to the Senator and the Senator told me his age. I wanted to know for sure. He tells me he is thirty-nine today.

May I ask the Senate to offer congratulations and many happy returns to the Senator from Kennebec County, Senator Leo Dunn? (Applause, members rising)

The PRESIDENT: The Chair thanks the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Lessard for making these appropriate comments concerning the birthday of the distinguished Senator from Kennebec, Senator Leo Dunn.
