An Act to Promote Forest Rehabilitation and Eliminate Clearcutting. Referred to Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry. Public Hearing 03/18/96. ONTP Accepted Pursuant to Joint Rule 15 03/26/96. Final Disposition: Paired with LD 1892 (CMR LAWS, Chapter 1) on Ballot and Failed in Referendum 11/05/96 (In favor of LD 1819: 175,078; In favor of LD 1892: 282,620; Opposed to both measures: 139,176).
