Referred to the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary. Public Hearing 01/25/22. Majority (OTP-AM) Report Accepted 03/24/22. Amended by: CA H-806. Final Disposition: Finally Passed, Signed 04/04/22, RESOLVE, Chapter 141.
